Context: End of the Gulf War, 4 years into an economic recession. Anger towards incumbent president George H.W. Bush's tax program. Character questions about Bill Clinton.




The Candidates

George H.W. BushRepublican
Vice President: Dan Quayle

Credentials: WWII Pilot. Incumbent President. Chairmen of the Republican Party (TX). Former House Representative. United Nation Ambassador. Vice President under Reagan.

Platform: Focus on curbing the national deficit. Investment in technological exploration (NASA). Increased spending on education and child care.




Ross Perot

Credentials: Served in the Navy. Successful business person. Involeved with party organization yet held no previous public office.

Platform: Balancing the budget, Pro Choice. Anti Drugs. Keep jobs in America. Opponent to gun control.

Results

Clinton won 370 Electoral Votes

2nd Largest Electoral Vote Shift

Perot Became the Most Successful 3rd Party Candidate

Implications

Ended 12 years of Republican control of the White House. Realigning election, despite Clinton being a Southerner he only won 4 of 11 exconfederate states. Successfully Balanced the budget and the nation had a surplus. NAFTA was passed (1994), welfare reforms. "Slick Willy's" presidential term stained by personal misconduct.
